PEPPER is a project co-financed by the European Commission that tries to enhance the effectiveness and efficiency of the police enforcement of road traffic. PEPPER aims to enhance the effective implementation of police enforcement by approaching the safety potential of traffic law enforcement (TLE) in a broader context, taking into account the scientifically verified impacts of enforcement, the prioritization of enforcement based on cost-effectiveness and data-led operations, whilst focusing on the essential enforcement areas of speeding, drink driving and seat belt use.

Workshop Content:

Sizeable changes happened in France in recent years, which are called 'the French experience', mostly marked by a new deal of road safety and enforcement policies. The presentation will refer in a first part to new management practices and a second part to impact of these changes on user's attitudes. (Marie Chantal Jayet & Jean-Pierre Cauzard)

Enforcement Performance Indicators (EPI) are an important component of an instrument to monitor TLE operations and their contribution to road safety across Member States. This session will discuss EPI in the light of identified best practices as well as the current practices of TLE data collection and registration. An outline of a conceptual model for a TLE data base will be presented and the seminar participants will be asked to give input on its structure, contents and functionalities, according to their field of expertise, in an interactive session (Ivanka Orozova-Bekkevold, Veli-Pekka Kallberg, Evangelia Gaitanido).

Address innovative technologies and its implications for TLE in the European Union. Innovative technology for monitoring traffic, vehicles and drivers and the impact of this new evolving technology concerning TLE will be presented. Special attention will be given to the subject of the implications of new technology for cross border enforcement (Jan Malenstein).

Present benefits and legal issues concerning administrative procedures in TLE, pros and cons. Results from the Netherlands and the French approach will be presented (Jan Malenstein).

Developing a good practice database on TLE operations and police activities (CLEOPATRA) is one of the tasks of the PEPPER project performed under the umbrella of the European Traffic Police Network TISPOL. The information on the database is retrieved from interviews and completed questionnaires from research institutes and police specialists in 6 EU countries. (Finland, France, German, Netherlands, Sweden, United Kingdom). More general information is retrieved from "Europe". At this moment the structure of the database is accepted and the database is partly filled with data. During the presentation the CLEOPATRA activities will be presented and a controlled demonstration of the content of the database will be given. The database is in development and will be available in 2008 (Cor Kuijten)

The aim of the Workshop will be to disseminate the PEPPER concept, diffuse preliminary findings of the project and get feedback and comments from the participants.
